

Raffle Rules

By purchasing a ticket the purchaser agrees to abide by the rules of the raffle.

The price of the raffle ticket is not tax-deductible.

The purchaser of ticket(s) must have his/her name, email address, and phone number printed legibly on each ticket stub. If more than one name is listed on the ticket stub, the first name listed will be considered the entrant.

Tickets are not transferable. The name given on the ticket stub will be deemed the winner if the ticket is selected. Entrant shall retain his/her ticket. In the event of any dispute or controversy concerning the winner of the raffle, entrant may be required to produce his/her raffle ticket

If a ticket is purchased by check that does not clear when presented to the bank, the ticket and the prize shall be forfeited and the holder of that ticket is ineligible to win any prize.

Any raffle ticket purchaser that pays for one or more raffle tickets with a check that is returned for NSF may be subject to a fee up to \$35.

There is no limit to the number of tickets that may be purchased by a single individual or the number of tickets that may bear the name of a single individual.

Tickets may not be sold to individuals under the age of eighteen without a parent or guardian present at the time of purchase.

The winner does not need to be present at the drawing to win. Bay Area Health District will contact the winner using the contact information provided on the ticket stub.

Volunteers, employees, and board members of Bay Area Health District dba Bay area Hospital and Kids' Hope Center are eligible to participate in the raffle and win the prize.

If the prize is not claimed within six months of the drawing or is refused by the winner within six months of the drawing, then the prize shall be donated to the Kids' Hope Center.

Winner is subject to and responsible for all federal, state and local income taxes and any other taxes, tariffs, fees or other amounts levied by governmental entities payable due to acceptance of the prize and the law, regulations, procedures, rules and directives applicable to raffles. All federal, state and local laws relating to the transfer, ownership or use of the prize apply. Prize shall not be transferred until all legal requirements have been met. The IRS requires that taxes on prizes valued greater than \$5,000 must be paid upon acceptance and before the Bay Area Health District may deliver the prize to the winner. Winners are encouraged to consult a tax professional.

To claim the prize, the winner of the raffle will be required to: (1) complete all forms required by the Internal Revenue Service; (2) pay the required withholding for federal income tax purposes; and (3) supply their street address and sign the Raffle Winners Record acknowledging receipt of the prize.
